Call for Abstracts 2021 Biennial Pediatric Sleep Medicine Virtual Meeting | Friday, December 3rd

The 2021 Biennial Pediatric Sleep Medicine Meeting seeks abstract submissions for Poster Presentations of research and educational endeavors. <u>Accepted abstracts will be virtually presented on Friday,</u> <u>December 3rd (exact times to be determined).</u>

In addition to a virtual Poster Presentation, authors of the top-rated abstracts, based on scientific merit and innovation, will be invited to orally present their work in one of two sessions on Friday, December 3rd.

The goals of these sessions are: (a) to provide the most current scientific findings focusing on pediatric sleep medicine, and (b) to provide an opportunity for individuals and institutions to share their own programs/innovations.

All poster presentations will be prerecorded however at **least one author is expected to be available in real-time during the meeting for question/answer session.** If your abstract is accepted, the presenting author is required to register for and attend the virtual Pediatric Sleep Medicine Conference. Registration is the responsibility of the presenters.

All abstract submissions should be 400 words or less, and should be structured according to the sections below. No tables, figures, or brand names are permitted in abstract submissions. You will need to complete this submission in one sitting, so please have the following information prepared:

- Author names, affiliations, and contact information
- Objectives
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusions
- Support (if relevant)

International trainees are encouraged to apply for the <u>Avi Sadeh Memorial International Trainee</u> <u>Fund</u>, which provides full registration to the 2021 meeting. To be eligible for this award, applicants must (1) be an international trainee (not currently living in the US nor a US citizen), (2) submit an abstract through this portal for the Pediatric Sleep Medicine meeting, and (3) present his/her research as part of oral presentation sessions (the program committee will work with the international presenter to align the session with the time zone as best as possible). To apply for this award, please include the following with your abstract submission:

- 1. Applicant CV: Including current mailing and email address (preferable), educational history, relevant employment history, honors and awards, research funding and publications.
- 2. Applicant cover letter (maximum 1 page): Including a statement certifying that the applicant has never received funding from the Sadeh Memorial Fund, a description of current research activities including the name and email address of the trainee's mentor and institution, a

description of the applicant's future career plans and goals, and a discussion of how attendance at the Pediatric Sleep Meeting will enhance the applicant's research and career plans.

All abstract submissions are due by 5:00 pm ET on July 15, 2021

Avi Sadeh Memorial International Trainee Fund award notifications will be sent by August 6, 2021
