Overview: This film screening and discussion of the Netflix documentary, 13th, highlights another symptom of racism, mass incarceration. In this thought-provoking documentary, scholars, activists and politicians analyze the criminalization of African Americans and the U.S. prison boom. We will host a simulcast and discussion of the documentary as acknowledgment of the inequities that continue, and thus will help us better understand the circumstances of our vulnerable patients.
