Overview: This 2022 live international symposium, sponsored by The Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University, will bring together researchers, innovators, and problem solvers from the United States and around the world to address research, innovative projects, and practical solutions to promote compassionate, healing relationships in healthcare as technology transforms clinical interactions, incorporating lessons from the pandemic. We shall explore this topic from a variety of perspectives with diverse patients and caregivers, practitioners, educators, technology designers and vendors, government leaders, institutional leaders, and healthcare stakeholders.

The Scientific Committee is particularly interested in abstracts that explore the following themes:

- 1) **Lessons from the pandemic about promoting healing relationships in healthcare**
- 2) **Relationships matter more than ever in healthcare, and health information technology (HIT) is changing them**
- 3) **Addressing inequity in the social and digital determinants of health**
- 4) **Designing human- centered HIT – for practitioners and patients**
- 5) **Teaching HIT use to empower relationship-based care**
- 6) **Developing HIT competencies throughout healthcare**
- 7) **Staying well in the evolving world of HIT**
- 8) **Working with government, institutions, and stakeholders to protect and promote healing relationships and human capital**
- 9) **Shared data: implications, ethics, and stewardship**
- 10) **Addressing misinformation and the misuse of HIT and social media**

We look forward to reviewing research, innovative projects, and practical solutions. Work in progress will be considered.

Innovative presentation methods and styles are welcomed, and collaborative submissions are encouraged. The program will combine thought talks, presentations of research and ideas, and opportunities for practical group problem solving.

- ◆ 10-minute presentations of research, innovative projects, and practical solutions

- ◆ Information regarding previous delivery of the session (if applicable) including, date, setting, audience, evaluations
- ◆ References (up to 5)
